Our Academy curriculum is focussed on realising our vision:

'At OHA, we provide an inspirational and ambitious learning journey to enable our students to achieve beyond their Horizons.'

We are committed to providing an ambitious, broad, balanced, inspirational curriculum whilst preparing our students for the challenges ahead. We match our curriculum to the interests, aspirations and abilities of our students by considering our three Academy values of Resilience, Respect and Responsibility.

Our Academy curriculum intent is that the curriculum:

- Broad and balanced: All students have the opportunity to study all subjects on the National Curriculum including PSHE and RSE. This allows all students to develop emotionally, intellectually and creatively and provides an opportunity to follow their own journey towards their achieving beyond their horizon.
- Preparation for the future: We believe that all students should experience a solid foundation at Key Stage 3 and therefore all students follow a three-year Key Stage 3. This ensures that OHA students have the skills, knowledge and understanding to have a successful Key Stage 4 and open doors to both Post-16 study and future employment.
- High aspirations: We have designed a curriculum which is enjoyable, ambitious and motivates all students including SEND and the most disadvantaged towards lifelong learning.
- Promotes the Academy values: Our students will demonstrate Respect, Resilience and Responsibility throughout their daily life at the Academy.
- Rich knowledge based: Students will leave OHA following five years of study, fully prepared for a variety of ambitious destinations. By providing students with extended and independent learning, our students will be ready to embrace the wider world around them.

The OHA Curriculum is delivered through a programme of a three-year Key Stage 3 and a two-Year Key Stage 4. The curriculum is delivered through a two week, 50 period timetable per week. Students study all subjects on the national curriculum and follow pathways as well as core subjects at KS4. All subjects follow the Key Stage 3 National Curriculum and GCSE specifications at Key Stage 4. We aim to build upon the prior learning students have undertaken during their primary education phase.





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# YEARS 7-9, KEY STAGE 3

Students study Maths, English, Science, Humanities, Technology, Computing, Performing Arts, Art, PE and Modern Foreign Language giving them the opportunity to ever enhance their understanding of other cultures and an ever increasing global economy.

# YEARS 10-11, KEY STAGE 4

In Years 10 and 11 students follow a core curriculum offer, together with a range of GCSE and BTEC subjects that students have opted for at the end of Year 9. Subjects studied in Key stage 4 are taken through to certification with a range of examination boards. The table below summarises the core and options curriculum offer to all students in Key Stage 4.

We believe that every child has unique talents, gifts and needs, so we take a personalised approach to everything we do.

Each year group has a head of year, Raising Standards Leader and a team of Personal Tutors. Your child will meet daily with their Personal Tutor who will ensure that they are encouraged to exceed their expectations. Student attendance, behaviour and progress is monitored by the pastoral team. We also have Pastoral Leaders and an Academy Counselor who support students on a daily basis with any issues that may arise.

Students are supported and guided in one of our four houses, so they are part of a smaller family within the Academy community. The Academy has a team of educational support specialists so students have access to the resources they need. You will receive regular written reports and be invited to parents' evenings to discuss your child's progress.

## **HEALTHY LIVING**

Across the Academy there is an emphasis on balanced, healthy lifestyles through the Academy Meal Policy and the ecological building design. We encourage students and staff to be aware of their health and well-being, to consider what they eat and drink and support involvement in health related fitness, physical activity and sport. Students have access to a fully equipped, state-of-theart fitness suite and all students study Sports Science at Key Stage 3 and a Sport qualification at GCSE.

We pride ourselves in the vast amount of opportunities that we offer our students at OHA. Enrichment activities take place throughout the year to ensure all of our students have the opportunity to develop and excel in an area of their choice.

If you like it, you can do it at OHA. Samba Band, Choir, Dance Club, Drama Club, a range of sporting teams, Debating Club, Radio Club and Chess Club starts to give you a flavour of our extensive programme.

On 'Personal Development Days' students participate in a range of challenging and team building activities, alongside visits to universities and further education centres. Inspirational speakers and organisations like the Army, the Health Service and the Police are invited to show students the wide ranging careers available to them.

# **TRANSITION**

Many children find the move to secondary school exciting, whilst others may find it daunting. We minimise any worry by making sure all new students spend some time at the Academy before their first day. All our new students spend a week at OHA before they start in September, sampling lessons, meeting new teachers and using the restaurant. We also run Saturday Academy which allows the students to meet new friends and try out a range of new activities. Our aim is to ensure that a happy and secure working atmosphere is established where learning can readily take place, and every student is motivated to achieve their best. We also run a free Summer School every year for our new Year 6 into Year 7 students.

## STUDENT AND PARENT VOICE

Our students are the experts in their learning experiences and needs. All students have a say in Academy practice, policy and procedures. Each tutor group has a representative who brings the views of students to the Student Council and to the Principal. We also have a student prefect team who help support Academy life and act as role models to their peers.

We also survey parents and carers throughout the year to gather their opinions and views on current practice and future ventures.

#### DEVELOPING OHA CHARACTER

As an Academy, our aim is to best equip young learners with the taught qualities which will enable them to do the right things at the right times and thrive in the community We believe that by offering explicit opportunities which encourage them to make moral decisions, we provide safe space to grow content, confident and caring members of society.





### MULTI-MILLION POUND BUILDING

Our multi-million pound building has exceptional resources for our students and the local community. Much of the learning space is dedicated to Health, Fitness, Performing Arts, Science and new technologies. It provides formal and informal teaching accommodation, assembly space, performing spaces and a learning resource centre.

Amazing facilities such as a 3D studio, 4D immersion room, fitness suite, multi-use games areas and sand-based AstroTurf along with our sports hall and swimming pool ensure our campus is second to none. Classrooms benefit from lots of natural light and views over the school grounds.
