Revision List:

All students will sit a 1 hr 45 min paper on the following topics:

- American West, 1835-1862;
 - Indigenous peoples of the Plains: their beliefs and ways of life
 - Migration and early settlement
 - Conflict and tension
- Anglo-Saxon and the Norman Conquest, 1060-1066;
 - Anglo-Saxon society
 - The last years of Edward the Confessor and the Succession Crisis (House of Godwin, Tostig, Death of Edward)

Additionally, students will be expected to sit a paper on **EITHER** Medicine **or** Germany. These will cover the following topics:

- Medicine, c1700-Present;
 - Ideas about the cause of disease and illness
 - Approaches to prevention and treatments
- Trench Medicine;
 - Significance for medical treatment of the nature of the terrain and problems of the transport and communications infrastructure.
 - new techniques in the treatment of wounds and infection, the Thomas splint, the use of mobile x-ray units, the creation of a blood bank for the Battle of Cambrai.
- Germany;
 - Early development of the Nazi Party, 1920–22
 - The creation of a dictatorship, 1933–34
 - The creation of a police state, 1933–1939
 - Nazi policies towards women
 - Nazi policies towards youth
