Correlation	Understanding the associated and drawing scatter graphs. Strengths & weaknesses.		
Research procedures.	Standardised procedures, instructions to participants, randomisation, counterbalancing, understanding the impact of extraneous variables and how to control them.		
Ethical considerations	Ethical issues outlined in the British Psychological Society guidelines and ways of dealing with them.		
Data handling	Primary & secondary data/ descriptive statistics: mean, median, mode and range. Fraction, decimals, percentage & significant figures		
Interpretation and display of data	Construct & interpret frequency tables (tally charts) bar charts histograms & scatter graphs/ Normal distribution.
