# **English**

## **Year 8 Overview**

In Year 8, students develop reading and writing skills through varied texts and themes. In Autumn, they study Journey's End and war poetry, focusing on summarising ideas, language, symbolism, and historical context, while improving planning, vocabulary, and structure in writing. In Spring, they read Animal Farm and speeches, analysing persuasive techniques, character, and political themes. In Summer, they explore The Yellow Wallpaper and other extracts, comparing texts and refining clarity and organisation. By year's end, students produce more complex analytical and persuasive writing.

## Curriculum Plan

#### Words of War:

Key Texts: Journey's End, War Poetry

**Reading Skills:** Summarise key ideas, Analyse and interpret fiction, Select and embed evidence, Understand word connotations, symbolism, and figurative language. Explore writer's methods, intent, and links to context

**Writing Skills:** Plan and structure ideas clearly. Use effective vocabulary and figurative language. Apply cohesive paragraphs and clear organisation

#### The Art of Rhetoric:

Key Texts: Animal Farm, Famous Speeches

**Reading Skills:** Develop understanding of persuasive techniques and character construction. Evaluate intent and link to historical/political context

**Writing Skills:** Continue to refine clear planning, vivid language use, and cohesive, well-structured writing.

#### **Wayward Women:**

Key Texts: The Yellow Wallpaper, Various Extracts

**Reading Skills:** Compare texts using literary methods and concepts

**Writing Skills:** Continue to develop the ability to plan and structure ideas clearly, use effective vocabulary and figurative language, and apply cohesive paragraphs with clear organisation

## Homework:

All homework is set on Sparx Reader from Wednesday to Wednesday. Students are expected to complete 30 minutes of independent reading a week and achieve 300 SRP

## Assessments:

In each unit, there will be a midpoint knowledge check and an endpoint knowledge check and analytical writing task. Students will also complete a 'big write' in each unit. There are two main formal assessment points during the year:

**AP2 w/c 22nd June** - formal assessment reviewing students understanding of grammar taught throughout the year
