Dear OHA Community,

As we approach half term, I am delighted to be able to share with you some really exciting news that will benefit the school and the wider local community.

After a significant amount of work behind the scenes and a number of different fundraising events, I am thrilled to let you know that OHA has been awarded a major grant from the Football Foundation—funded by the Premier League, The FA and Government—to support the development of a brand-new 3G pitch on our site. This investment recognises both the strength of our plans to grow women's and girls' football and the fantastic fundraising efforts of our pupils and staff, whose commitment has helped bring the project to this stage.

While this is an exciting step forward, the project will take time to progress through the necessary planning and construction phases, so we'll keep families updated as timelines become clearer. Once complete, the new facility will provide a high-quality space for all our students to play, train and enjoy sport for many years to come.

I want to take this opportunity to thank all the staff and students who have been involved in the project to this point. As you can imagine, a significant amount of time and effort has already been invested and we are really excited about what the coming weeks and months will bring.

Y11 Mock Exams

As we approach the Year 11 mock examination period, we would like to ensure that all students and families have the key information needed to feel prepared and confident.

The mock examination schedule has also been sent out via Edulink – please take time to review the timetable carefully with your child to ensure they are fully aware of dates, times and any specific requirements.

Examination Conduct & Malpractice

It is important that students understand the expectations around exam conduct. Mock examinations follow the same regulations as formal GCSE exams.

Malpractice includes:

- Bringing unauthorised materials into the exam (e.g. mobile phones, notes, smart watches).
- Communicating with other candidates during the exam.
- Copying or attempting to share answers.
- Any behaviour that could give an unfair advantage.

Any incidents of malpractice will be taken seriously and will result in sanctions being put in place.

Attendance Matters

Full attendance during the mock period is extremely important. These exams provide valuable experience and inform future support, predicted grades and intervention. Please ensure your child attends all scheduled exams and arrives punctually.

We are very proud of the hard work Year 11 students have shown so far. We wish all of our Year 11 students the very best of luck in their mock examinations — you've got this!

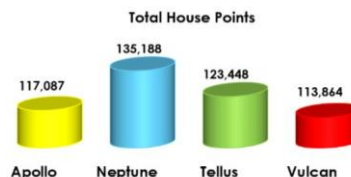
Our second chess tournament of the academic year has already broken the record of the highest number of entries and certainly looks like it'll become the longest running if the final isn't played before the week is out.

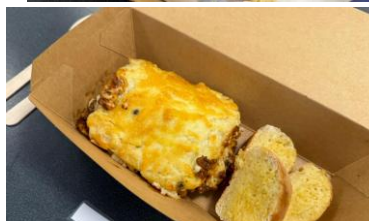


